#	Discussion points
1	Q: Is it a must to strictly adhere to the provided time-line?
	C: Duration of the project implementation shall be 40 weeks but major variations from this time frame may not be considered positively.
2	Q: How long will it take to complete the procurement of necessary hardware and software?
	C: Time-lines have been given considering the typical time-lines for all related procurement items. Procurement of SOC solution (hardware and software) will be initiated soon aftre specifications are ready.
3.	Q: There are certain dependencies for this assignment on other procurement items. What would be the time-frame of 40 weeks if delays occur?
	C: The dependency is obvious; and any delay will have be addressed if a situation arises.
4.	Q: Can the consultant be the solution provider as well?
	C: Please refer Instruction to Consultant clause 1.6: Conflict of Interest (page 8).

5.	Q: Would the consultant be penalized if there is a delay by ICTA with the other related procurements (location, facilities etc.)?
	C: The consultant will not be penalized for the delays which the consultant is not liable.
6.	Q: Why do we need an insurance cover (Special Conditions 3.5)?
	C: This is to ensure that the consultant takes the necessary precautions against any risks that may occur during the performance of the contract to ensure smooth implementation.
7.	Q: In page 35 (3.5b), are you referring to a cyber-event or accidents in general?
	C: Incidents in general.
8.	Q: Should the sub-contractor be insured as well?
	C: It should be arranged between the consultant and their respective sub-contractors.
9.	Q: According to page 68 (3.8) ICTA will retain ownership of certain intellectual properties owned by the consultant. Are you enforcing this?
	C: Refer the clause carefully. 'All plans, drawings, specifications, designs, reports, other documents and software submitted by the Consultant under this Contract shall become and remain the property of the Client'.
10.	Q: How are you going to assess the Standard of Performance as stated on page 67 (3.1.1)?
	C: The consultant shall always act in a faithful manner to the client in the performing of the contract.
11.	Q: As a foreign consultant, will you be helping us with any issues in relation to Visa?
	C: We can provide you with the necessary documentation that will help clarifying your purpose of visiting Sri Lanka. But it is up to the consultant to handle the visa process.
12.	Q: What currency should be used when providing the total on the bid?
	C: Refer 3.8 of 'Instructions to Consultants'.
