ICT Agency of Sri Lanka Terms of Reference:

Hiring a consulting firm to assist the ICTA M&E unit to produce regular project performance monitoring/implementation progress reports and conduct regular field monitoring activities (ICTA/SG2/GOSL/CON/QCBS/2017/001)

1. Background:

Information and Communication Technology Agency of Sri Lanka (ICTA) is the apex government institution, responsible for formulating policies and implementing projects towards digital development of the country. The Government of Sri Lanka (GoSL) has recognized the critical role that ICT can play in fostering social integration, peace, growth, and poverty reduction. The Government intends to use ICT to improve the reach and responsiveness of public services, reduce transaction costs to business, make government more transparent and accountable, and especially address the needs of the poor communities and citizens in geographically isolated regions. With the objective of fully leveraging the benefit of digital technologies in every sector of the country, ICTA commenced the implementation of Digitalization of the Economy' initiative in 2016.

Currently, ICTA is in the process of implementing number of national digitization initiatives including i) developing required digital infrastructure across the country to effectively serve all citizens irrespective of the geographical regions that they are living, ii) creating an enabling environment required for the knowledge economy; iii) delivering faster, more efficient, and more transparent government services to all citizens and businesses; iii) developing specialized ICT skills and broad ICT literacy across the society, iv) promoting the competitiveness of IT and BPO industry and v) promoting widespread ICT adoption and empowerment of citizens across the country. In order to achieve the outcomes of these initiatives, ICTA has already commenced over 80 projects in collaboration with various stakeholder organizations.

ICTA M&E System: Having recognized the critical role of M&E in measuring the progress of these initiatives, ICTA implements a comprehensive monitoring and evaluation (M&E) system across all the projects and programmes. The main objectives of the M&E are: 1) measuring of performances, ii) evaluating progress towards outcomes, iii) institutional learning: improving focus and performance orientation iv) understanding and negotiating stakeholder perspectives v) public accountability, vi) measuring impacts vii) building M&E related capacities of internal project teams and stakeholders

ICTA M&E process can mainly be categorized into two components; a) Ongoing monitoring b) Periodic Evaluations.

i) Ongoing Monitoring system

This component focused on the collection and collating of data generated from project implementation (monitoring data) for the purpose of: a) measuring the progress against planned targets including the procurement process, b) monitoring the implementation progress and quality of outputs, c) understanding the levels of stakeholder engagements d) measuring the usage levels of project services by beneficiaries.

Internal project management team is responsible for collecting and entering data in to an internal database system and currently M&E team is engaged in consolidating and formats designed by various stakeholder organizations.

Handling massive amounts of data generated through the procurement processes and project implementations from nearly 600 subprojects/procurement line items has become an extremely complex task for the internal M&E team.

In order to collect data required to take decisions on improving project performances, ICTA M&E team is conducting regular field visits to the beneficiary organizations. In these site visits Rapid Appraisal techniques such as focus group discussions, direct observations and field discussions are used to gather required data and such findings are communicated to the project management teams to take appropriate corrective measures and also communicate good practices and lessons learnt during these visits.

Furthermore, M&E unit also engaged in continuously reviewing international benchmark indices such as International Telecommunication Index (ITU), Networked Readiness Index (NRI) and UN e-Government Index to understand the country's standing in terms of ICT development.

ii) Periodic Evaluations:

Project specific baseline and evaluation surveys are conducted under this component. (This section also included cost benefit analysis for some of the newly designed projects. Baseline and outcome related data are collected through project specific as well as cross cutting /overall surveys)

To ensure the reliability, validity, rigorousness, and objective nature of evaluation data, evaluation activities are to be outsourced to a competent external consulting firm/consultants through competitive bidding process. However, data collection process will be closely monitored by the internal M&E team

2. Objectives of the assignment:

The main objective of the proposed consultancy is to assist the ICTA M&E unit and provide project implementation and management support services in producing and timely submission of the regular performance monitoring reports and conduct as and when required field visits targeting various stakeholder organizations. The consultant is required to ensure the quality and accuracy of the data of progress reports that they produce.

2.2. Specific objectives of the assignment:

The specific objectives of the assignment are;

- a) To produce the regular performance monitoring reports with required quality in agreed frequencies using the given formats. The data required for the report should be extracted through the internal data base system which is updated by respective project managers twice a month. The consultant is required to follow up of timely updating the system with reliable and consistent data.
- b) To carry out monitoring activities at the field level to ensure quality of data gathered by independent evaluation consultants contracted for specific program evaluations. Based on the visits the consultants are required to produce field monitoring reports with evidences based corrective actions.
- c) To assist the M&E unit to evaluate objectively the quality of ICTA events (such as trainings, technical sessions/exhibitions, workshops, and etc.).

3. Scope of work and key tasks to be carried out:

- i. Meet the representatives of ICTA and gather details of the requirements of the consultancy. The consultants must peruse all documentations necessary and conduct a document/literature review to develop good understanding projects implemented by ICTA and their present status of implementation. The documents to be review include project log frames, project plans and proposals, M&E reports so far produced.
- ii. The consultant must develop excellent working relationships with the M&E team and the project staff. To understand the project implementation level the consultants are expected to closely engage with client's staff to exchange and validate data/information.
- iii. The consultant is expected to establish an effective and conducive mechanism to smoothly follow up the data collection and updating processes, validation and quality assurance of data collected. To provide, a detailed Implementation approach and the Plan outlining all the steps involved in planning and implementation of the assignment, including a time schedule, resource plan, data management plan and submit to ICTA in electronic form and as a hard copy. The consultant is responsible for producing regular reports by using the reporting formats given. Table-(1) presents the details of the reports the Consultant needs to produce. The consultant is responsible and accountable for the quality standards of the reports submitted to ICTA.
- iv. To undertake field visits to facilitate data collection processes for evaluation/survey activities. These field visits must be conducted objectively and in highly professional manner and should be done in collaboration with ICTA M&E team. Based on the visits the consultants are required to submit field monitoring reports based on the observations made.
- v. Additionally, the consultant is responsible for conducting field monitoring visits to the beneficiary organizations in collaboration with the ICTA project management teams and M&E team. In these visits the consultant is expected to carry out evaluation research activities by using rapid appraisal techniques. For this purpose consultant must be equipped with necessary evaluation skills, expertise

- and best practices in evaluation and expertise. Based on the visits, the consultant is expected to produce field monitoring reports with forward looking corrective actions.
- vi. ICTA organize various events, training programmes, and change management events under different projects to improve the capacities of the stakeholders and beneficiaries. To ensure the effectiveness and impacts, these training programmes and events should be planned and implemented by using appropriate techniques and methodologies. To evaluate the quality, appropriate evaluation activities must be implemented by the consultant in consultation with ICTA staff. The consultant must have proven expertise to conduct such evaluation activities in an effective manner.
- vii. The consultant in his bid shall present the best practices of survey management and field monitoring methods and any additional quality control measures that are essential. The consultant in the bid must discuss as to how the proposed approach will support for achieving the objectives of the assignments
- viii. To implement the above mentioned activities successfully the consultant must have the proven expertise of M&E and the best practices that is required to be applied throughout the assignment must be discussed in bid.
